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About This Content

The GE 44-ton switcher is a small but tough switching locomotive first built in the 1940s, and is now available as a Pennsylvania Railroad switcher for the Horseshoe Curve.

Built by General Electric specifically to weigh no more than 44 short tons in order to fit in with the labour agreements for train crews in those days, the GE 44-tonner was created during the early days of the transition from steam to diesel freight haulage in North America and found work on railroads across the country. Regulations at the time said that any locomotive weighing more than 44 tons must have a second crewman in the cab: the GE 44-tonner could be run with only a driver, saving money for the railroad. More than 350 examples were built up until 1956, with various power units being fitted over the years, and around 20 still exist in preservation across the US and beyond.

Developed for Dovetail Games by Digital Train Models, the GE 44-ton switcher comes in PRR black livery with scenarios for the [Horseshoe Curve](#) route.

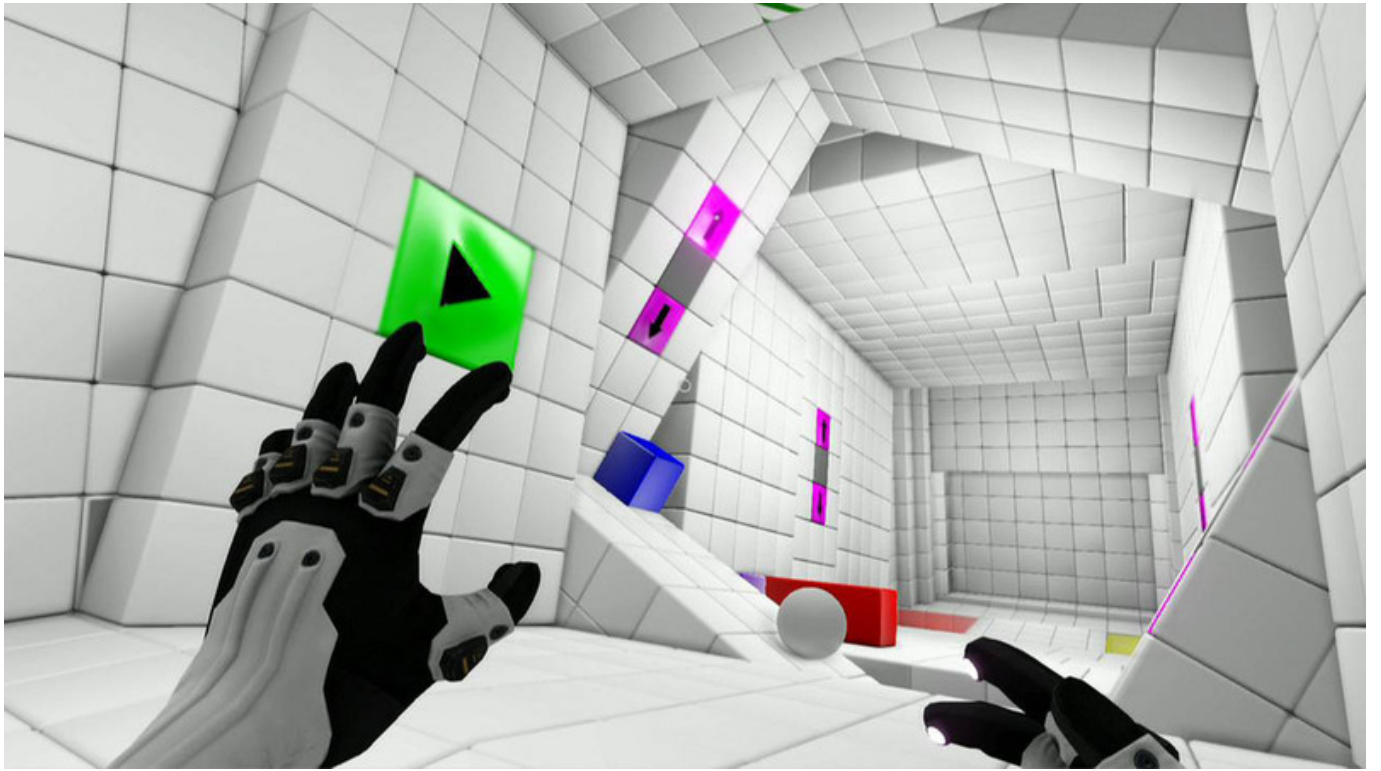

But I would say it's recommended more for the beginner as it's less complicated and with no means to adjust or alter things like reverb or pitch.

The selection of sounds however is not bad for an app with such an affordable price.. Overall grade: A-

The game is a very fun, the puzzles are well made, and the changing mechanics keep you on your toes throughout the game. The game also boasts a very beautiful and detailed world, with differing environments and actions that mingle well with the dynamic mechanics of the world. Not to mention the VERY interesting story, and a (metaphorically) EXPLOSIVE ending! (Seriously, the ending is the best part, in my opinion.) And the main story of the game, albeit somewhat short, is not the end of the game's content, as you will soon find out that there are special hidden(ish) puzzles interlocked with the main puzzle.whether or not the price tag for this game is justified is completely up to the user. Personally, I would pay \$20 for the game, but I think a price of \$15 or maybe \$10 would have fit the brief story better.

My PC can be considered extremely average by most, and this game continued to do a number on it for the duration of my playtime. I ran at a maximum of 40 fps, but hovered around 10-20 fps for most of the game. I commonly find myself lowering the graphic settings for other games I play, to accomodate for my less than amazing tech; Pneuma: Breath of Life does not have the ability to do so, or has very little ability to do so. The fact that I stuck around to finish the game and play the puzzles definitely says something about this game.

Get it?: Yes, if you like inventive puzzling and semi-comical narration about the purpose of life and your place in the universe, definitely give it a go.

I always found anything within the puzzle & match 3 genre to be relaxing, but this one had minor annoyances to me.

~ I can't slide the pieces, I have to click the one I want to move and click where I want it to go.

~ You can't pause. So you have to complete the puzzle or go to the main menu screen.

~ I turned off music in the main menu screen, but once I clicked "Play", it turned back on again. And since I couldn't pause and click "settings" which most games would allow you to, I had to tab out and mute the game as a whole.

~ Little content, achievements came quite easy (which is a curse and a blessing).

To me, based off of all the puzzles I have done in the past, this gets a 5/10.

It's just not fun and at times it doesnt even seem well thought out or balanced.

It has a bunch of different gameplay elements with different block types and stage conditions but It honestly feels like they add nothing to the game because unfortunately none of them are fun.

The achievements are "easy" in the sense that the majority of them can be popped by creating custom stages and letting the game idle for hours on end while the level plays out by itself. I'm not sure how the story achievements are activated, but I skipped a good amount of levels and still got them all.. Glovesmith really scratches the manager itch for me but I will say, as it is in early access, there is a clear lack of content.

If you aren't prepared to wait for updates, I'd err on the side of caution and hold off until there's more to do and the developers prove it isn't just more steam abandonware (at the time of writing, there has not been an update in two months).

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
